## **'Even' results in pre-Pennant trial games**

**DOUBLE BAY won three of its six matches in the opening round of the Zone 11 Pre-Pennant Round Robin competition played in the Eastern Suburbs last Saturday.**

Two of the wins came from the lower grade sides, the Grade 5 scoring 5½-½ points (57-43 shots) away win at Waverley, while the Grade 6 side won 5-1(68-48) at home to Alexandria Erskineville.

The Grade 3 side collected all six points at Kensington, but the Grade 1 went down by one shot (64-65) on home turf against Kensington in a 4½ -1½ points result.

The rink of Les Brem, who replaced the injured Matt Fetherston, Arnold Javen, Brandon Conway and Gerald Weinberg, needed a two on the last end. Weinberg was one down when he had the matt and got the shot with his first delivery, but failed to make it two with his last bowl.

The Grade 2 side was stunned by the strength of visiting Eastlakes and succumbed 0-6 (43-82), while the Grade 4 unit at Alexandria Erskineville did little better in a 1-5 (45-62) loss.

# Fours skipper's chance to repeat 2002 title win

**BRANDON Conway (pictured) has the chance to turn back the clock 10 years when he takes his team into the final of the 2012 Major Fours Championship final on Sunday.**



In 2002 Conway, alongside Doug King, Alan Rosenberg and Ken Wallis won the Major Fours title.

This year Conway's team of Rob Fetherston, Mark Sack and Matt Fetherston is given a top chance of claiming the title against Pepe Glick's combination of newcomers John Woods and Mike Becker with experienced Alan Rosenberg, the constituted fourth player.

Glick's unheralded unit caused the boilover in last Sunday's semi-final when they knocked out the tournament's heavyweight entry of Alan Simmons, Gerald Weinberg, Bernard Fridman and Jack Kampel by scoring two shots on the 22<sup>nd</sup> end.

At the same time Conway's unit, with Eddie Fingret coming for Matt Fetherston, who was nursing a back injury, cruised past the semi-final challenge of Len Sandler's foursome of Ray Novis, Les Brem and Eric Wainstein to the tune of 29-7.

All the drama was being played out on the Glick v. Kampel rink where Werner Kos (pictured right) turned out for the absent Rosenberg.

Kos, who was chairman of selectors at Double Bay in 2007, is also a member of Coogee Bowling Club and is its 2011 Major Singles Champion. He has now switched his Pennant and Club Championship priority to Double Bay.

The Kampel team looked comfortable in the early ends of the match leading 10-6 on the 10th.



Then Glick (pictured left) came back with a five count on the 14th to take the lead 15-12 and held the advantage 19-17 on the 18th.

A two count by the Kampel outfit on the 21st end tied the score at 20-all and the jack was rolled for an extra end. Glick won the tie-breaker with two shots 22-20.
